DESCRIPTION OF THE ADVERTISEMENT

This print advertisement features two women, a brunette and a blonde, shown bare-shouldered.

THE COMPLAINT

Comments which the complainant/s made regarding this advertisement included the following:

The pictures are provocative and verging on pornographic. These are on the same page as cartoon downloads and music downloads.

THE ADVERTISER'S RESPONSE

The Advertiser did not to respond to complaint.

THE DETERMINATION

The Advertising Standards Board (“Board”) considered whether this advertisement breaches section 2 of the Advertiser Code of Ethics (the “Code”).

The Board noted that the picture of the young women was sexually suggestive and featured some bare skin. The Board considered that the depiction of sexuality and nudity was not pornographic and was not inappropriate to the intended and likely ‘Take Five’ magazine audience.

Further finding that the advertisement did not breach the Code on any other grounds, the Board dismissed the complaint.
